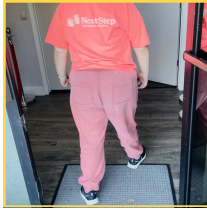

If it's too loud, its ok to wear headphones or use earplugs.



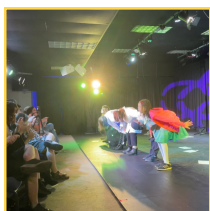
I can move to the dance studio if I need a break from the show

I can watch and listen to the actors quietly. I can applaud if I like something. I can hold things in my hand that make me feel comfortable.

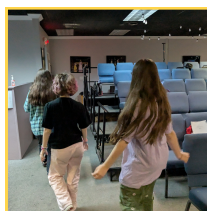
End of Show & Exit

The audience exits the theatre calmly.

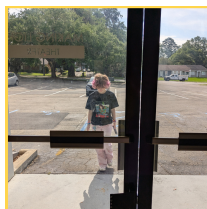
Time to Leave
